Course objectives	<p>To enable you to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Break the mould of using trees chosen from a core list • Make use of the aesthetic power of trees to create bold organic compositions • Understand the principles of design and historical development • Preserve historic treescapes by avoiding ill-considered planting or management schemes

It will provide a rare insight into this important area of arboricultural activity – and it may change the way you look at trees in the designed landscape forever.</p>
