

- Over 61,000 volunteers







Brief history of Ethy





- 1st recorded settlement in 1100s
- Present house built around 1750
- 1932 Charcoal making in Ethy wood continuing
- •Post War housing estate taken from the SE part of the estate
- 1959 estate given to the National Trust as endowment to St Michael's Mount



47ha17ha of Woodland





National Trust at Ethy





- acquired estate in 1959
- Conifers planted in wood pastures in the early 60's
- House and gardens sold in 1989
- farms and outlying lands sold between 1992 - 1996
- Parkland restoration begins 1999
- Orchard restoration completed in 2008
- Wood pasture restoration began in 1997 and is still ongoing





•Control of Holly for Lichens




