







Colaba residents rope in private expert to audit trees in their area

As BMC hands out tree trimming contracts to desilting and transport contractors, residents take matters in own hands.

With the BMC handing out tree trimming contracts to desilting and transport contractors and rising cases of people getting injured or killed by falling trees, residents of Colaba have roped in a private expert to audit trees in their area. With the help of arborist Vaibhav Raje, residents

have audited more than 100 trees on main roads and have found that at least 10 of them are in a dangerous condition and need immediate treatment. If they stand unattended they can fall, putting at risk lives of people.

Colaba residents say their tree survey can serve as guideline and suggestion for the BMC on how to conduct a tree audit.

A citizens-led audit of trees in Colaba has revealed that 17 of the 100 trees surveyed on JD Somani Marg and Captain Prakash Pethe Marg face the risk of falling down. A detailed report – prepared by the group, My Dream Colaba, with the help of an expert arborist – states that while two trees are

in the extremerisk category, 15 others are high-risk and can fall any time, causing loss of lives and damage to property. The other 79 trees are in moderate-risk category and only four face low risk. The survey is the brainchild of local BJP corporator Makarand Narwekar, who is also a member of the Colaba residents' group.
